

Scope 1 and 2 correspond to emissions directly emitted by the company and those indirectly linked to its energy consumption. Scope 3 emissions are those emitted by the company's suppliers and those emitted during the use and end of life of the products it creates.

The green share is the percentage of a company's revenue devoted to economic activities that contribute positively to energy and ecological transition.
